Vessel Safety Checks

Make sure that your recreational vessel – any size, any type – is outfitted with the safety equipment required by federal and state laws. These checks are provided FREE to the public and are performed by trained Auxiliary personnel.

VSC's can be conducted with boats in the water or on a trailer.

Worcester, MA area:
